

Searching for a 'Pot of Gold'?

OVER THE RAINBOW by Arlen & Harburg remains the No. one song of the American Film Institute's [AFI] top 100 list.

But, Did You Know?

- Responding to virulent reaction before the curtain closed on the first sneak preview \mathcal{L} . \mathcal{B} . \mathcal{M} ayer removed OVER THE RAINBOW from the WIZARD OF OZ for the 1^{st} of 3 times before the film's final release.
- Lyricist Y *ip Harburg* dithered with 'I'll go over the rainbow', 'Someday over the rainbow', long before he came up with 'Somewhere over the rainbow.'
- Harburg continued oscillating believing 1st the song too symphonic for a 16 old *Judy Garland* and 2nd too old for the character of Dorothy.
- Songwriter *Harold Arlen* was ready to throw in the towel until *Ira Gershwin*, a customary arbitrator, offered his favorable opinion.
- Author Aljean Harmetz declared, "Without Judy Garland's unique voice & tragic future being tied to OVER THE RAINBOW the picture would never have taken on the qualities of poignancy, seriousness, & irony."
- Yet *Margaret Hamílton*, the wicked witch, & others recall Judy, at 16 years old, as absolutely enchanting, cheery, and a joy to be around.
- Director King Vidor, just weeks before production ended, restaged OVER THE RAINBOW with Judy walking instead of standing still to give some rhythmical flow of movement into the ballad.
- Many Producers thought it ludicrous to shoot OVER THE RAINBOW in black and white, again calling for its removal from the film.
- This time Arlen protested vigorously asserting, "These great jerks. Money is power. Money rules the world. The artist is lucky if he can get a few licks in."
- Before the release of the film, OVER THE RAINBOW soared to No. 4 of the 10 largest sheet-music sellers. **THAT ENDED THE DEBATE**.

So Wot! You might say? Well, undertaking such a signature song of Judy Garland may be a challenge that meets more than the eye can initially see. The Corps may have to view this tune in a very different light.


OVER THE RAINBOW sounds simple. In reality it is a complex symphonic musical and dramatic tapestry which deserves — no, demands — a thorough and masterful attention to detail.

So **embrace** Jamie's tedious technical, yet invaluable, ensemble exercises with stern determination and conviction. And **explore** those undefined aesthetic components (expression, imagery, purity, joy, emotional touch, feelings, yearning) with all the imagination you can muster.

Keep in mind, we all know that **feeling of 'longing'**. But what does it sound like? Can anyone instruct someone to play 'longing'? I think not But you will know when you hear it.

Better yet — you will know when you feel it.

Cuz if you don't the 'pot of gold' at the end of your RAINBOW might well prove to be elusive.
